

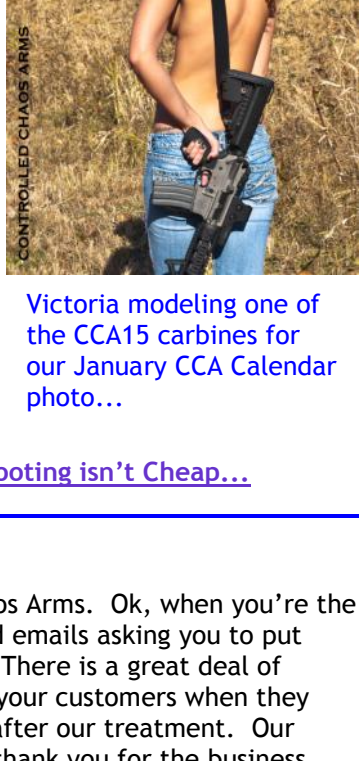

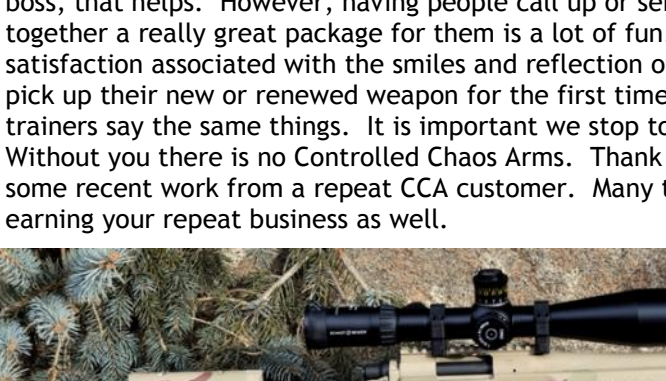
You spoke and we listened—CCA coatings gone wild.

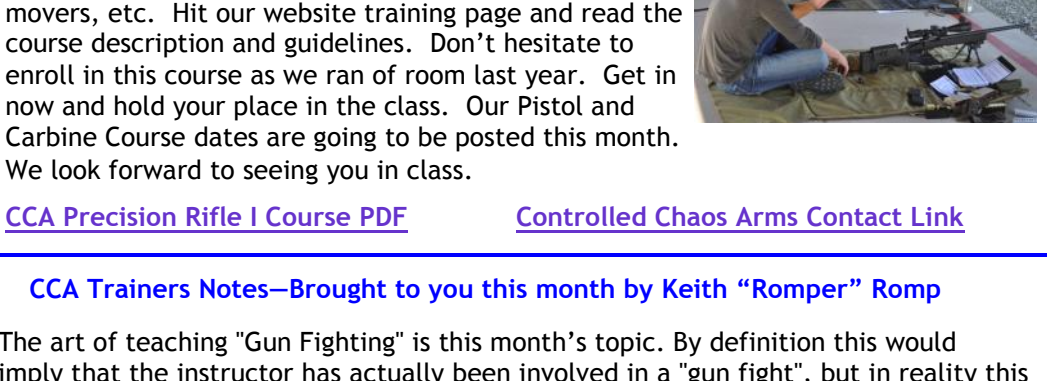

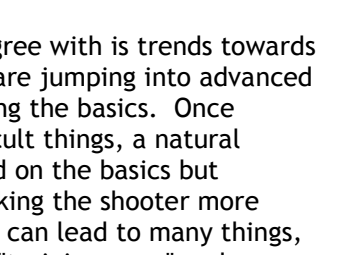
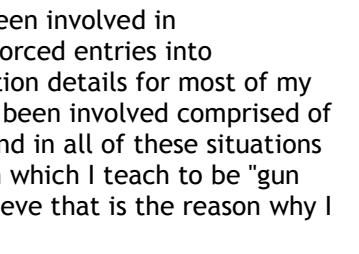
Do we like building rifles? Why yes, yes we do...

CCA Trainers Notes—Brought to you this month by Keith "Romper" Romp

The art of teaching "Gun Fighting" is this month's topic. By definition this would imply that the instructor has actually been involved in a "gun fight", but in reality this basically means that the instructor has been trained to avoid the flat/square range mentality of training by shooting at paper targets only. This is a good thing, but with marketing what it is, it can become hype.

I have been a peace officer for almost 19 years. I have been involved in approximately 1700 firearm involved search warrants or forced entries into structures, worked on patrol, worked gang/crime prevention details for most of my career, and cannot count the number of situations I have been involved comprised of suspects having a weapons. Yet I have only fired one round in all of these situations combined. I do not consider what I do, or the methods in which I teach to be "gun fighting". I would rather call it good tactics. I firmly believe that is the reason why I have not had fired my weapon more than once.

Another aspect of teaching "Gun Fighting" that I do not agree with is trends towards getting the cart before the horse. Simply put, students are jumping into advanced level classes way too soon. I am a strong believer in learning the basics. Once students are comfortable moving forward into more difficult things, a natural progression to advanced classes manages to not only build on the basics but compliment them. This constructs a solid foundation, making the shooter more comfortable in the worst situations. Starting out too fast can lead to many things, most of which are negative and commonly referred to as "training scars" and more seriously putting a basic student into an advanced class can cause some serious safety concerns. Food for thought.

CCA—AR15 Build Clinic, Full Auto Shoot, and Rimfire Competition

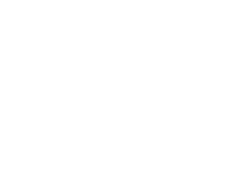
